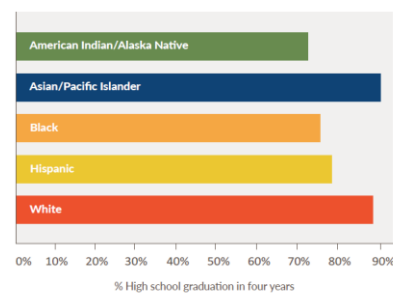

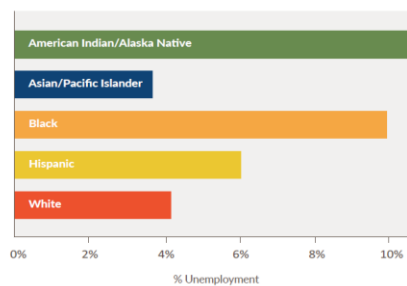

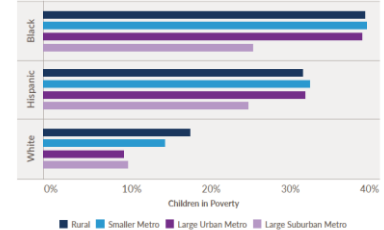
HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION BY RACE/ETHNIC GROUPS, 2014-15
